FIRST AND SECOND CONDITIONAL



FIRST CONDITIONAL:

If + **Present Simple** \Rightarrow Future Simple (**Will + Infinitive**)

or

Future Simple (**Will + Infinitive**) \Rightarrow If + **Present Simple**

SECOND CONDITIONAL:

If + **Past Simple** \Rightarrow Conditional (**Would + Infinitive**)

or

Conditional (**Would + Infinitive**) \Rightarrow If + **Past Simple**
